## INSTRUCTIONS

For filling up the Columns headed "Profession or Occupation."

**COLUMN 10.**—Enter the Occupation **only** in Column 10. If more than one occupation is followed, state it by which living in each household.

2. DEPENDENTS, SHOPIERS OR SHOP ASSISTANTS at distinct from **MAKERS, PRODUCERS OR REPAIRERS**.—All such persons should be listed under "Shop Assistants," "Shopkeepers," "Retailers," "Manufacturers," "Tradesmen," "Artisans," &c., and their assistants not set apart.

3. OUT OF WORK.—If out of work or disengaged at the time of the Census, the **usual occupation** must be stated.

4. THE OCCUPATIONS OF WOMEN engaged in any business or profession, including women regularly engaged in assisting relatives in trade or business, must be fully stated. No entry should be made in the case of wives, daughters, or other female relatives wholly engaged in domestic duties at home.

5. CHILDREN AT SCHOOL AND STUDENTS. For all persons over ten years of age attending school, write "School" and for those attending colleges, evening schools, or other instructional classes, or receiving instruction privately, as "School." If studying for any profession, if it is not taught in any other school, half time enter "half time at school."

6. RETIRED OR PENSIONED.—If retired or pensioned state the fact, and add former occupation, as "Retired Farmer," "Retired Butcher," "Policeman," &c. The present occupation, if any, of pensioners should be in all cases, as "Army Pensioner, Bank Porter, &c."

7. PRIVATE MEANS.—For persons following a profession or occupation, but deriving their income from private sources, otherwise, write "Private Means."

8. VAGUE OR INDEFINITE TERMS MUST NOT BE USED ALONE, such for example as Apprentice, Assistant, Carpenter, Collector, Contractor, Foreman, Inspector, Laborer, Mechanist, Manufacturer, Merchant, Mechanic, Milliner, Osteopath, Supervisor, &c., also paragraphs 10 to 12 inclusive, in which the name of the occupation is used, should be used in all cases, as "Fitter," "Painter," &c.

9. RAILWAY STATIONERS.—If employed in any employment take the employment, as "School, Railway," "Shop, Railway," "Police Stationer," &c.

10. FARMERS.—For persons following agriculture having followed a profession or occupation, but deriving their income from private sources, write "Private Means."

11. CLOTHIER, DRUGGIST, MINISTER, MINISTER OF STATE, &c. Those who are in charge of a church should be described as "Parishioner," "Curate," &c.

#### NOTICE.

This Schedule must be filled up and signed by, or behalf of, the Head of the Family or older person in occupation, or in charge of the dwelling house, tenanted or occupied.

If a house is let or sublet to two or more occupiers such occupiers will fill up a Schedule for each part of the house, and the head of each part of the house will fill up a Schedule for his part of the house. Besides are not to be considered as separate occupiers.

In the case of Hotels, Boarding Houses, Clubs, and other similar establishments, the Keeper, Manager or other person in charge must fill up a Schedule with respect to all the inmates.

The Schedule will be filled up for **MONDAY APRIL 3rd**, by the Head of the household or Enumerator; in order that the day may not be delayed it must be ready with the answers written in the proper columns early on the morning of that day.

If the answers are incomplete or inaccurate, the Enumerator may ask any question necessary to enable him to correct the Schedule.

If any person whose duty it is to give information refuses to do so, or wilfully gives false information, or omits to give necessary information, he will be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding **FIVE POUNDS**.

If the Head of the Family or older person responsible is unable to give the Schedule personally to the Enumerator, he may cause another person to do so. If caused to do so, per quidem.

The contents of the Schedule will be treated as strictly confidential.
